










 detaching from the current dominant ways of being online and relating to technology





What is the Indie Web?

- Independently published websites
- Social networks (Neocities, webrings, blogs, etc.)
- Home to counter/sub cultures and social movements (ex. **Web Revival**)
- Playful, creative space for personal expression (ex. Shrines)
- Wild Web, Net Positive, Small Web, Poetic Web, Retro Web, Neocities
- Webcrafter as the "backyard activist" and "bedroom artist"

You have to be okay with death. change. endings.

The recent update I did led some people to believe I'm leaving for good. In fact, I was preparing to return! But I understand why it seemed otherwise. Words like "death" and "endings" convey a note of finality.

I've always felt a strong connection to the metaphorical concept of death as a necessary step before rebirth. In that sense, I have "died" more than once. Some deaths are more painful than others. But transformation is one of the most beautiful and exhilarating parts of being alive.



One thing you'll learn if you stick around here long enough, is that I tend towards intensity. I think in some ways it was easier to be myself as a teenager. That's because it's much more socially acceptable for a teenager to be dramatic and intense and emotional. I don't think I have it in me to be laid-back or casual, except as a poorly-fitting and hollow disguise.



- The community grew and the organizers couldn't maintain the desired social (modeators) and political (decision-making) standards


